

## **2018 Scholarship - Student**

The Georgia Chapter of the International Concrete Repair Institute (ICRI) will **award up to \$2,000.00 in scholarship(s) to a local Undergraduate Student**. The mission of ICRI is to improve the quality of repair, restoration and protection of concrete and other structures. This student scholarship program helps us complete this mission by recruiting new resources in talent, ideals and youthful energy. To this end, we are proud to offer this educational scholarship to qualified students who are pursuing post-secondary education.

**Qualification: Undergraduate Students** attending school full-time in Georgia. At the time of application, the applicant shall be pursuing a degree in engineering, architecture, construction management, material science, or any other relevant degree. Verification of enrollment is required.

As a condition of accepting this scholarship, the applicant shall:

1. Give a 10-minute presentation at one of the monthly Georgia Chapter ICRI luncheons. The topic of the presentation may be on the student's research or other area of interest related to the concrete industry. **(Required)**
2. Participate in the promotion of ICRI at the student's institution. This may include participation in or formation of a student chapter of ICRI at her/his institution, provide a presentation about ICRI to other students at their institution, assist in coordinating an outreach project through the Georgia chapter, or other activities that promotes the mission of ICRI. **(Optional, but highly encouraged)**
3. Join as a Student Member of Georgia Chapter of ICRI and attend at least 2 Monthly ICRI meetings. **(Required, entrance will be provided at no cost to student)**

## **\$2,000 Student Scholarship:**

### **Requirements.**

Applicants must be a full-time, undergraduate student in a related construction or engineering degree program.

### **Submissions.**

1. Verification of Enrollment
  - a. Please submit a scanned copy of most recent transcript to review course work, grades, and full-time status.
2. Extracurricular Activities List
  - a. Submit a PDF list of all extracurricular activities you actively participate in.
3. Short Essay and Abstract
  - a. 300-word (max) short essay in PDF form. Students may choose to submit an essay which outlines their interest in concrete repair or a response to the question below.
    - i. One of the biggest questions in concrete restoration is how much is enough? As it relates to concrete demolition and ultimately restoration, what are the key factors used to determine the extent of concrete deterioration and an adequate substrate condition and/or surface profile for repair?
  - b. An abstract in the form of a PDF or PowerPoint for a 10 to 20 minutes presentation. If awarded this scholarship, the recipient will be required to present to the ICRI-GA members in 2019. Students may choose to present over the above short answer topic, or another concrete repair related topic. (For assistance, please reach out to professors or Joshua R. Lloyd, EIT)

### **Judging Criteria.**

- a. 50% Essay & Abstract
- b. 40% GPA
- c. 10% Extracurricular

Example:  
 Essay/Abstract = 10 pts  
 GPA (3.7) = 8 pts  
 Extra-Curricular = 4 pts  
 $(0.50 \times 10) + (8 \times 0.40) + (0.10 \times 4) = 8.6$  out of 10
